Everyday Life at School

Christianity and the expectations of our Catholic faith are part and parcel of all actions and activities, which occur each day in our community. The day begins with our National Anthem, followed by the Gospel Reading of the day and prayers led by our students that focus on the Virtue of the Month. Prayer is an integral part of our day and children pray with their teachers in a variety of ways and at different times throughout the day, such as grace before meals.

Student Catholic Equity and Well-Being Ambassadors promote Social Justice Projects within the school (i.e., Terry Fox Marathon of Hope, Angel on the Tree for Christmas, Gifts sponsoring SVDP; Food Drives; Share Life; Rosary Apostolate, Stations of the Cross, etc.)
